I have several smaller, more common sized burls that I will make cuts on to show grain and discuss cutting possibilities. The 500 pound white oak burl will be brought in and discussed and evaluated for cuts. I'll cut several sections from the burl and hopefully they will yield some great blanks for turning, not just expensive firewood. With weather being a concern, I will do the cutting inside with an electric chainsaw. I doubt ear protection will be necessary but please use your own discretion. Safety glasses are a must for those wanting to be the closest to the cut.

In answer to numerous questions about how I sign my work, here is the pen I currently use. There is a family of these available at Hobby Lobby – each with a different sized tip. I use the 1 mm size,

and it works very well for me. The ink does not bleed when covered with most finishes, although when I use lacquer I'm very careful not to rub the area until after the first coat cures. *Aaron Gesicki*
